### Term dates

### Packed lunches

A polite reminder that packed lunches should contain some form of a sandwich or similar carbohydrate based food – chocolate and sweets should not be included. Children should also have a water bottle in school.

### We expect all children to come to school wearing school uniform.

While children have appropriate white shirts and blue jumpers, sweatshirts or cardigans some pupils are still coming with inappropriate trousers or dresses. These should be grey or black. Dresses should be of a suitable length – checked summer dresses are acceptable but jeans, leggings or similar are not suitable for school. Jewellery should not be worn and nails must be kept short. *Thank you to the families that always follow these straightforward rules.*

For PE children should have a suitable change of clothes with a t-shirt in red, blue, yellow or green depending on which house they are in.
