Unit Plan: What can I celebrate, and why? (5 weeks)

Rationale

Pupils start this unit thinking about what they celebrate with their families and why. This unit aims to foster as inclusive learning environment that explores the richness of religious festivals and traditional celebrations. By engaging with diverse cultural experiences, children develop an understanding and appreciation of the world's varied traditions. Exploring themes such as religious festivals, birthdays and weddings provides a unique opportunity for children to learn about the significance of these celebrations. The unit will promote cultural awareness, encouraging children to respect and embrace differences reflected in the school and in society. Through hands-on activities and age-appropriate discussions children can explore the similarities and differences of the celebrations, fostering social and emotional development.
